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Update to Knoxville’s One Year Plan

Knoxville, Tennessee – January 29, 2019 – The annual update of the City of Knoxville’s One Year Plan has begun, and the public is encouraged to participate. The One Year Plan serves as the foundation for zoning decisions and is based on the land-use goals, objectives, and policies found in the City’s long-range plans.

Three meetings have been scheduled to give community members the opportunity to review and discuss recommended changes to the One Year Plan:

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Information will be shared at each meeting and will be specific to the geographic areas of the City indicated above. No presentation will be made, but stations will be set up to address various topics, and staff will be available to talk to attendees one-on-one. Topics of discussion at these meetings will include:

- Plan amendments since the 2018 update;
- Permitted land uses and zoning districts;
- Development policies; and
- Illustrations of differences between permitted land uses and zoning.

Knoxville-Knox County Planning

Knoxville-Knox County Planning (formerly Knoxville-Knox County Metropolitan Planning Commission) was established in 1956 by Knoxville and Knox County as the agency responsible for comprehensive county-wide planning and administration of zoning and land subdivision regulations and remains so today (except for the town of Farragut). Funding comes primarily from city and county appropriations and from federal grants for specific studies. The agency prepares and adopts a general plan, reviews subdivision regulations and site plans, prepares and recommends zoning ordinances and maps to the Knox County Commission and Knoxville City Council, reviews proposed zoning amendments, and prepares a capital improvements plan for the City of Knoxville.
