One Year Plan Final Draft Available

Knoxville, Tennessee – February 23, 2023 – The final draft of the City of Knoxville’s One Year Plan, as well as a summary of revisions, is now available on [Planning’s website](#). The One Year Plan serves as the foundation for zoning decisions and is based on the land-use goals, objectives, and policies found in the city’s long-range plans.

Two virtual meetings were held to give community members the opportunity to review and discuss recommended changes to the plan. The meetings included a presentation covering all geographic areas of the city, followed by an open discussion. A recording is available for anyone who was unable to attend. Residents are encouraged to utilize the public comment feature on the One Year Plan webpage.

The plan will be heard by the Knoxville-Knox County Planning Commission in March, and by Knoxville City Council in April. Meeting details are below.

Knoxville-Knox County Planning

Knoxville-Knox County Planning (formerly Knoxville-Knox County Metropolitan Planning Commission) was established in 1956 by Knoxville and Knox County as the agency responsible for comprehensive county-wide planning and administration of zoning and land subdivision regulations and remains so today (except for the town of Farragut). Funding comes primarily from city and county appropriations and from federal grants for specific studies. The agency prepares and adopts a general plan, reviews subdivision regulations and site plans, prepares and recommends zoning ordinances and maps to the Knox County Commission and Knoxville City Council, reviews proposed zoning amendments, and prepares a capital improvements plan for the City of Knoxville.
